Chapter I-Instructions to Bidders

TENDER FOR AWARD OF RATE CONTRACT FOR SUPPLY OF HOMOEOPATHIC MEDICINES FOR THE USE IN HOMOEOPATHIC DISPENSARIES AND 02 HOMOEOPATHIC INSTITUTIONS FUNCTIONING UNDER DIRECTORATE OF AYUSH, GOVT. OF NATIONAL CAPITAL TERRITORY OF DELHI.

The Director, Directorate of AYUSH, GNCTD (hereinafter referred to as Tender Inviting Authority) invites online bids for finalizing Rate contract for supply of **Homoeopathic Medicines** for the use in 121 Homoeopathic Dispensaries and 02 Homoeopathic Institutions namely, Nehru Homoeopathic Medical College & Hospital, Defence Colony and Dr. B R. Sur Homoeopathic Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, Moti Bagh, New Delhi functioning under Directorate of AYUSH (Homoeopathic Wing), Govt. Of NCT of Delhi for Two years and further extendable to additional One year on mutually agreed terms and conditions and satisfactory performance of the supplier.

The tender shall be available on Delhi Government e-procurement portal <https://govtprocurement.delhi.gov.in> The tender document can be downloaded free of cost.

The Bidder is expected to examine all instructions, forms, terms and specifications in the bidding document. The bid should be precise, complete and in the prescribed format as per the requirement of the bid document. The bid should not be conditional. Failure to furnish all information required by the bidding document or submission of a bid not responsive to the bidding documents in every respect will be at the Bidder's risk and may result in rejection of the bid.

2) Clarification of Bidding Documents

A prospective bidder requiring any clarification of the bidding documents may seek clarification on the tender document during pre-bid conference which shall be held at **2.00 P.M. on (Date 01/07/2026) in the Office of Directorate of AYUSH, A&U Tibbia College Campus, Ajmal Khan Road, Karol Bagh, New Delhi-110005**. The clarification of the queries would be uploaded on the Delhi Government e-procurement portal <https://govtprocurement.delhi.gov.in> if required. Bidders are supposed to consider all the clarifications/amendments while preparing their bid proposals. **Therefore, bidders are requested to visit the said website on regular basis for checking necessary updates. These changes can be incorporated within 3 days before the date of bid opening.**

3) Amendment of Bidding Documents

At any time till **3 days** before the deadline for submission of bids, the Purchaser may, for any reason, whether at own initiative or in response to a clarification requested by a prospective Bidder, modify the bidding document by amendment. All amendments will be hosted on the website regularly. Purchaser shall not be responsible to notify the amendments to individual bidders. All amendments by the purchaser till 3 days before the deadline for submission of bids, shall be binding on the participatory bidders.

The tender portal has been designed in such a manner that it will not accept any bid after the deadline. Purchaser may in exceptional circumstances and at its discretion, extend the deadline for submission of proposals by issuing an addendum on the tender portal

4) Eligibility criteria for bidders:

Bidders meeting the criteria as in **Column II and III of Form-I {Chapter-III, Eligibility criteria for bidders-Pre Qualification Bid}** shall only be eligible for submitting bid. The firm may submit their bids if the terms and conditions are acceptable to them and they meet the eligibility criteria. All relevant documents must be submitted online in support of their eligibility for the tender.

5) Documents constituting the bid

The bid prepared by the bidder shall comprise the following components:

i. Pre qualification bid

Pre qualification bid will be uploaded by the bidder in **Form-I** along with the requisite documents as mentioned in the form. Bidder will be required to attach scanned copies of signed documents as per requirement.

Bidder will submit an undertaking on a Non-Judicial Stamp paper of Rs.100/-, on **Form-II**. A copy of the undertaking shall be uploaded on tender web site and the original document shall be submitted by the bidder in the office before the opening of Pre qualification bid along with the original earnest money deposit document (**EMD**).

ii. Technical Bid

The Technical bids uploaded in **Form-III** of eligible bidders will be opened on specified date and time as mentioned for evaluation. Samples as specified in **Form III** will be accepted in the office on specified date and time. No sample after specified time will be accepted.

iii. Financial Bid

The financial bids of all the technically qualified bidders will be opened for financial evaluation.

- a) Financial Bid will comprise of Price Schedule on **Form-IV** for Medicines Items. The bidder will be required to submit its price in excel format attached to the tender document.
- b) Price Bid is to be submitted online only and **no copy is to be submitted physically**.
- c) Prices quoted by the bidder shall be fixed per unit and inclusive of all taxes, duties, levies, cess, Octroi/entry tax, surcharge, cost incurred for testing at NABL/Govt. approved laboratories, freight charges including delivery at the designated place as per purchase/supply order, loading, unloading, insurance, road permits, packing etc. Taxes/GST as applicable shall be quoted separately in respective columns.

6) Bid validity period

The bids shall be valid for a period of 180 days from the date of opening of the Technical Bid and the Tender Inviting Authority may request the bidder to extend the bid validity. If the bidder refuses the extension of bid validity, then his bid will be rejected without forfeiting the Earnest Money Deposit.

7) Earnest Money Deposit (EMD)

- i. An amount of **Rs. 4,40,000/- (Rupees Four Lakh Forty Thousand only)** as Earnest Money [**@ 2% of the tentative estimated value of the tender Rs. 220 Lakh**] shall have to be deposited in person in the form of Demand Draft /Fixed Deposit Receipt/Bank Guarantee in favour of **Director, Dte. Of AYUSH, Government of NCT of Delhi** payable at Delhi, in the **Office of Head Of Office Homoeopathic Wing, Dte. Of AYUSH, Govt. of NCT of Delhi First Floor, CSCIII, B- Block, Preet Vihar Delhi-92** latest by the last date and time of bid submissions, in physical form and details of the same shall be submitted online with Bid.

- ii. The details of the DD/any other accepted instrument, physically sent, should tally with the details available in the scanned copy and the data entered in the submitted Bid. Otherwise the uploaded bid will be rejected.
- iii. The EMD will be refunded to the lowest bidder **within 30 days** from the date of signing the contract and on the submission of Performance Security Deposit (PSD).
- iv. EMD of the unsuccessful bidders would be returned to them on or before the 30th day after the award of the contract.
- v. The EMD shall be forfeited if a bidder withdraws its Bid during the period of Bid validity specified by the bidder in the tender document.
- vi. If the supplier fails or neglects to observe or perform any obligation under the Contract or breaches any of the Terms and Conditions of this proposed Notice Inviting Tender (NIT), it shall be lawful for the purchaser to forfeit the Earnest Money Deposit / Performance Security Deposit Furnished by the supplier and the firm will be debarred/ deregistered for a period of **Five years**.
- vii. EMD should be valid for a period of 180 days.
- viii. **MSEs** (Micro and Small Enterprises), **CPSUs** (Central Public Sector Undertakings) registered under National Industrial Classification (**NIC**) **Sub-class: 21004**-"Manufacturer of homoeopathic or biochemic pharmaceutical preparations" and **SPSU** (State Public Sector Undertakings) Bidders are exempted from Earnest money deposit (**EMD**). However, CPSUs and SPSUs must submit Bid Security Declaration (**Form-VII**), while **MSEs** units mandatorily submit a duly signed valid NSIC certificate along with the Bid Security Declaration(**Form-VII**) to claim the EMD exemption.

8) Rejection of Bid

- a) Any bid not secured in accordance with above mentioned clause, shall be rejected by the Purchaser as being non-responsive, without any further correspondence. The Bid has to be uploaded through E-tendering on the website only. **The bids submitted by telex, fax or email or any other mode of communication shall not be entertained.**
- b) Any condition put forth by the bidder not-conforming to the bid requirements shall not be entertained at all and such bid shall be rejected.
- c) Any effort by a bidder to influence the Purchaser in its decisions on bid evaluation, bid comparison or contract award may result in rejection of the bidder's bid.

9) Submission and Processing of Bids

The bidder shall submit Pre Qualification, Technical and Financial bids on Delhi Government e-procurement portal <https://govtprocurement.delhi.gov.in> on formats mentioned above. The bidder shall scan and attach all the relevant documents including copy of earnest money deposit document, Undertaking etc. on the web site. Bidders will be required to submit original undertaking

and earnest money deposit document i.e. Demand Draft /Fixed Deposit Receipt/Bank Guarantee in favour of **Director, Dte. Of AYUSH, Government of NCT of Delhi** payable at Delhi, in the office of **Head Of Office (Homoeopathic Wing), Directorate of AYUSH, CSC-III, First Floor, B-Block, Preet Vihar, Delhi-110092.**

All bid documents uploaded on the tender portal should be signed by a person or persons duly authorized by the Bidder for the Contract.

10) Last date for Submission

The last date for bid submission can be extended by the purchaser without assigning any reasons.

11) Modification and Withdrawal of Bids

The portal allows modification or withdrawal of bids before the bid closure date.

12)OPENING OF BIDS:

I. Opening of Pre Qualification Bid:

The Purchaser will first open Pre-Qualification Bid in the presence of Bidder's representatives who choose to attend the Pre-Qualification Bid opening meeting in the office of Homoeopathic Wing of Directorate of AYUSH, CSC-III, 1st Floor, B-Block, Preet Vihar, Delhi-110092 on specified date and time. The Bidder's representative who wishes to attend the meeting shall carry printed "**Bid Summary**" for entry to the meeting. Only one person will be allowed against this. In the event of the specified date of Bid opening being declared a holiday for the Purchaser, the Bids shall be opened at the appointed time and location on the next working day.

Result of Pre-qualification bid evaluation will be posted online.

II. Opening of Technical Bid:

The Technical bid shall be opened in respect of those bidders who have qualified in Pre-Qualification Bid, in the office of Homoeopathic Wing of Directorate of AYUSH, CSC-III, 1st Floor, B-Block, Preet Vihar, Delhi-110092 on specified date and time in the presence of qualified bidder's representatives who choose to attend the bid opening meeting. The Bidder's representative who wishes to attend the meeting shall carry printed "**Bid Summary**" for entry to the meeting. Only one person will be allowed against this. The Technical Bids (samples of Medicines/items) will be evaluated by the Technical Evaluation Committee of Directorate of AYUSH (Homoeopathic Wing). In the event of the specified date of bid opening being declared a holiday for the

Purchaser, the bids shall be opened at the appointed time and location on the next working day.

The bidder/manufacturing firm shall provide the following certificates in respect of:-

A. Dilutions:

1. Certificate of identification of raw material which should include in house/ outsourced NABL/Government approved /GMP Certified testing.
2. Documents which explain or prove the preparation of dilution method and machinery.
3. Certificate of final testing of dilution from NABL/Government approved testing Laboratory for particular items.

B. Mother Tinctures (Internal/External)

1. Certificate of identification of raw material which should include In-house/ outsourced NABL/Government approved /GMP Certified testing.
2. Documents which prove that proper maceration/percolation and ageing procedures were carried out.
3. Certificate of analysis of MT prepared with TLC plate picture from NABL/ Government approved testing Laboratory for particular items.

C. Other products (Bio-chemicals, Triturations, Ointments, Eye & Ear Drops)

1. Certificate of identification of raw material which should include in house/ outsourced NABL/Government approved /GMP Certified testing.
2. Documents which explain or prove the preparation method and machinery.
3. Certificate of final testing of these products from NABL/Government approved testing Laboratory for particular items.

Result of Technical bid evaluation will be posted online

I. Opening & Comparison of Financial Bids:

The bidders who have qualified in Technical bid will be eligible for the opening of Financial Bids. The date and time of opening of Price Bid will be announced on the e-portal after the completion of evaluation of Technical Bids.

Participating Pharmaceutical firms must quote for the Quantity / packing specified against each item in the schedule annexed to the Rate Enquiry Form, as any other packing may not be accepted. Rate should be quoted strictly for the same pack as per specification given in the tender enquiry. Bids with rates quoted in any other form will be rejected.

The Financial bids will be opened in the presence of qualified bidder's representatives who choose to attend the Financial Bid opening in the office

of "Directorate of AYUSH, A&U Tibbia College Campus, Ajmal Khan Road, Karol Bagh, New Delhi-110005" on specified date and time. The Bidder's representative who wishes to attend the meeting shall carry printed "**Bid Summary**" for entry to the meeting. Only one person will be allowed against this.

Result of Financial Bid evaluation will be posted online.

13. Contacting the Purchaser

No bidder shall contact the Purchaser on any matter relating to its bid, from the time of bid opening to the time the Contract is awarded. If the Bidder wishes to bring additional information to the notice of the Purchaser, it should be done in writing.

14. Purchaser's right to accept any bid and to reject any bid or all bids

Notwithstanding anything else contained to contrary in this Tender Document, the Purchaser reserves the right to accept or reject any bid or to allow the bidding process fully or partially or modifying the same and to reject all bids at any time prior to the award of Contract, without incurring any liabilities in this regard.

15. Notification of Award

The Purchaser shall notify the successful bidder in writing by registered letter that its bid has been accepted. The bidder shall acknowledge in writing receipt of the notification of award and will send his acceptance to enter into agreement within fifteen (15) days.

16. Signing of Agreement

The successful bidder shall be required to execute a contract agreement as in Form-Von Non-judicial stamp paper of Rs. 100/- duly attested by Notary/Legal Attesting Authority containing all terms and conditions as per the tender document within 15 days of issue of Award of Contract. The signing of agreement will finalize the award of contract and the Contract Awardee will initiate the execution of the work as specified in the agreement.

17. Performance Security

To ensure due performance of the contract, Performance Security of **5% of** estimated value of supply to be procured should be furnished by all successful bidders in the form of an Demand Draft in name of "**Director, Dte. Of AYUSH, Government of NCT of Delhi OR as indicated in the supply order**". This Performance Guarantee shall remain valid for a period of sixty days beyond the date of completion of all contractual obligations of the bidder/supplier including warranty obligations.

Failure of the bidder to meet its obligations for supply of Goods in time and as per the Terms and Conditions of the contract shall entail forfeiture of Part/Full amount of Performance Security as per the relevant clause of Terms and Conditions.

18. Forfeiture of Performance Security

Performance Security amount in full or part may be forfeited in case the contractor fails to abide by the terms and conditions of contract fully or partially.

Chapter II- Conditions of Contract

(A) Packing and Labelling:-

- 1- Each packing shall be printed with nomenclature of the drug and shall be labelled in accordance with the requirement of the Drugs and Cosmetics Act. 1940 and Drugs and Cosmetics Rules 1945 made there-under. Packing and packaging of each drug must comply with the procedure provided under the legal Metrology Act. 2009 and rules made there under.
- 2- In the light of the amendment made in the Drugs & Cosmetics Act. vide Gazette Notification dated 18/01/2022 of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare; Govt. of India:-
 - (a.) Every active pharmaceutical ingredient (bulk drug) manufactured or imported in India shall bear Quick Response code on its label at each level packaging that store data or information readable with software application to facilitate tracking and tracing.
 - (b.) All the approved Pharmaceutical firms will make supply w.e.f. 01.01.2023 bearing Quick Response code (QR Code) on its label at each level packaging that stored data or information shall include the following minimum particulars, namely:—
 - (i) Unique product identification code,
 - (ii) Name of the API,
 - (iii) Brand name (if any),
 - (iv) Name and address of the manufacturer,
 - (v) Batch no.,
 - (vi) Batch size,
 - (vii) Date of manufacturing,
 - (viii) Date of expiry or retesting,
 - (ix) Serial shipping container code,
 - (x) Manufacturing licence no. or import licence no.
 - (xi) Special storage conditions required (if any)
- 3- Articles at Serial Nos. 1 to 10 of Appendix 'A', group (A) in Form-III (Chapter-IV) are to be supplied in amber colored glass bottles with dropper fitted plastic cork and good quality plastic screw caps in Sealed Condition.
- 4- Articles at Sr. No. 11& 12 Appendix 'A' groups (B) in Form-III (Chapter-IV) is to be supplied in amber colored glass bottles fitted with plastic plug and good quality plastic screw caps in Sealed Condition.
- 5- Articles in Appendix 'A' group (C) and group (D) Sr. No. 13& 14 in Form-III (Chapter-IV) are to be supplied in plastic containers sealed with aluminum foil and good quality plastic screw caps.
- 6- **Three sets of samples of Medicines at Sr. No. 1 to 19**(*in respect of only one drug of each potency*) of **Appendix 'A' & 'B' Group A to F in Form-III(Chapter-IV)** should be submitted at the time of Technical bid. Samples should be of same quality, quantity and packaging of proposed supply and recently (not more than 3 months older) manufactured from date of submission of sample for tender.
- 7- All packing of drugs must be according to specification laid down in Appendix 'A' & 'B' in Form-III (Chapter-IV). Each Medicine should be packed separately

and have uniform quantity in each packing (eg. 50 pcs, 100pcs, dozen etc. in each box).

- 8- All containers, packing cases etc. shall be sufficiently strong, durable and resistant to withstand the transit hazards. All cartons should be of good thickness and of durable quality with proper labelling showing name of medicine, quantity, name of manufacturer, date of manufacture, expiry date if any and batch number. Each medicine should be packed in separate box and remaining medicines of excess of that box should be in packed in continuation box and not randomly packed. All boxes should be numbered and packing of medicines should be in accordance to the serial number of medicines mentioned in order and accompanied with detail packing slip.
- 9- All labels of containers as well as the outer wrappers must be marked with the logo in English "**G.N.C.T of DELHI SUPPLY-NOT FOR SALE**" in bold letter with indelible ink as well as in Hindi " दिल्लीसरकार आपूर्ति-□□□□□ हेतु नहीं " and without MRP printed on labels.

(B) Purchase order time and terms of supply:-

1. If rates quoted by more than one bidder are same then the purchaser reserves the rights to enter into agreement and place orders with more than one contractor as he may think fit in the best interest of purchasing and law of equity.
2. The purchaser does not guarantee the quantity, which shall be ordered.
3. Supply orders can be placed against the contract up to the last date of the contract period. Orders even received on the closing date should be honoured in accordance with the terms of contract and supply can be accepted even after the expiry of contract. The purchaser will not pay separately for transit insurance and any breakage etc happens during transit of material.
4. Supply should be made as per approved samples submitted at the time of tender. (Samples should be of same quality, quantity and packaging of proposed supply as per approved sample for tender).
5. The supply of Medicines/goods shall be counted after receiving of consignment and if any breakage found the supplier shall replace the required quantity at his own cost or the equal amount shall be restricted from the original bill.
6. Supply should be made in complete consignment and not in parts unless otherwise approved by competent authority.
7. Supply should be made as per directions given in each purchase order.
8. Supply must be accompanied with
 - a. Challan
 - b. Warranty certificate

- c. Detail packing slips
- d. Bills in triplicate in the name of HOD i.e Director ,Directorate of AYUSH
- e. Batch wise medicine test reports from In-house/NABL Accredited Labs / Govt. approved Labs.

(C) DELIVERY PERIOD:-

- i. The supply period shall be indicated in the supply order placed by the purchaser and must be strictly adhered to. The supply period shall be usually of **45(forty five) days** from the date of issuance of supply order. However in case of emergency, purchaser reserves the right to place order with short supply period of 7(seven) days.
- ii. If due to some unforeseen/unavoidable reasons beyond control of the suppliers, supply cannot be made by supplier within the delivery period, prior written intimation for the same shall be given and extension of the same, which should be of another **30 days (thirty days)** must be applied for and permission obtained from the Competent Authority, failing which the supplies are liable to be rejected. The request for extension of delivery period must be submitted by the supplier to the purchaser within 30 days from the issuance of supply order.
- iii. In case, above said request for extension is not made in stipulated time OR extension not granted by the Competent Authority due to not acceptable reasons for extension given by supplier, the provisions of non-supply clause shall be applicable.
- iv. Further, an extension of another 15 days, subject to imposition of penalty, can be given after completion of the said grace period for supply of the goods. A penalty of 2% would be levied on quantum of non-supplied goods for first 8 days and further 3% for next 7 days.

(D) NON-SUPPLY:-

- i. After Ninety Days, the supply order shall automatically stand cancelled and penalty of 5% on amount for the non-supplied goods shall be automatically attracted and the same will be recovered from the supplier.
- ii. Two or more instance of non-supply, without any reasonable cause for a particular item by a firm will render the firm liable to be debarred to supply the said item for a future period of three years.

(E) Quality Assurance:-

- i. All Supply of Medicines mentioned in **Form-IV** should be accompanied with original test reports of Medicines tested from any/In-house Laboratory

certified by Drug Controlling Authority/ NABL. After receipt of supply, randomized samples of all batches of supplied Medicines are also liable to be tested from any Laboratory out of **Approved Drug Testing Laboratories(DTLs) in Delhi approved by Ministry of AYUSH; Government of India vide Letter No. T-14020/ 0/2022/DCC, dated 21, July 2022** as decided by buyer at the cost of the supplier.

- ii. The testing shall be done for all the batches of supply.
- iii. The testing can be undertaken immediately after receipt of supply and payment of medicines shall be released only after receipt of **satisfactory Randomized Test Reports from approved DRUG TESTING LABORATORIES.**
- iv. The testing shall be conducted against standards laid down in the Homoeopathic Pharmacopoeia of India (HPI). If a drug is not in HPI, it must comply with recognized foreign Homoeopathic pharmacopoeias.

The report of the Government approved Laboratory shall be accepted by the firm. In case the same is disputed by the firm giving reasons, the report of the Homoeopathy Pharmacopoeia Laboratory (Pharmacopoeia Commission for Indian Medicine & Homoeopathy)/any other Central Drug Testing Laboratory only will be accepted as final and the same should be submitted within three months, from the date, the disputed test report is communicated to the firm. For this, the firm should approach the concerned Drug Control Authorities for getting the drugs tested as per procedure from the designated Central Drug Testing Laboratory at their own cost.

In case of dilutions batch numbers should be in two parts-

- a- Main batch number- As per the batch of alcohol
- b- Sub batch number- As per the respective medicine

Test report of each main batch should be tested in the Drug Controlling Authority/In-house /NABL Accredited Laboratory for the purpose of Testing of Homoeopathic Medicines and original reports should be accompanied with the supply.

(F) Failure of sample:- If sample fails to pass the prescribed standards of quality, the department reserves the right to claim replacement with another batch of Medicines/refund of the payment for the entire supplies of that particular batch no./ Lot No. *[As per clause No. (E) of Chapter-II supply of all dilutions having same main batch number will be replaced with another batch of Medicines]*. Moreover, the fact may be notified to the unconsumed quantity of the substandard material. The stock of any item, which has been declared, not of standard quality shall be withdrawn from all the indenters and will not be returned to the supplier but will be destroyed by the Organization and the supplier, shall have no claim over such supply. The supplier shall have no claim over unconsumed goods, which shall also be destroyed. Cost incurred for the disposing of the failed articles/goods shall be borne by the supplier.

(G) The Nomenclature and Labelling of Medicines should be according to the Rule 106(A) of the "Drugs & Cosmetic Act." And if any failure of Test report of the Medicines items occur under this clause than the supplier shall be responsible.

(H) Bills and payment-

- 1- All bills should have following details in appropriate places of the invoices:
 - a) No. and date of bills.
 - b) No. and date of order.
 - c) Name and specification of item.
 - d) Quantity.
 - e) Unit cost; and total cost
 - f) Other details like packing unit, name of manufacturer etc.
 - g) No. & date of challan (If supply made by challan)
 - h) Bill inclusive of taxes but without any type of packing and freight charges.
- 2- The bill should be in triplicate in favor of Head of Department as specified in supply order.
- 3- The payment against supply of stores shall be made after receipt of **satisfactory Randomized Test Reports from approved DRUG TESTING LABORATORIES** in Delhi. However, no interest will be chargeable if the payment is delayed.
- 4- The payment of the bill shall be made after deducting Government dues and Income tax/Cess, GST, etc. if any.
- 5- The payment of the bills can be withheld in the following circumstances:
 - a) The goods are found sub-standard or in non-acceptable conditions
 - b) Breach of any condition of contract
 - c) Previous Government dues
 - d) Restriction to the original bills amount equal to the quantity for breakage during the transportation of goods.
- 6- Tax structure can be changed as per Government order/notification time to time.

(G) ARBITRATION:

In the event of any dispute arising between the parties in relation to or under this agreement, it shall be referred to the sole arbitration of Secretary, Health & Family

Welfare, GNCTD or any other officer of Directorate of AYUSH nominated by him, notwithstanding the fact that such officer has been directly or indirectly associated with the contract. The firm will not be entitled to raise any objection for the appointment of such officer of Directorate of AYUSH as the sole arbitrator.

The award of the arbitrator shall be final, conclusive and binding on all the parties to this contract. The venue for the Arbitration shall be Delhi/New Delhi. The

arbitration will be governed by the provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996. The cost of arbitration shall be equally borne by both parties. Any letter, notice or other communications dispatched to the parties through arbitration proceedings or otherwise, whether through the post office or through a representative on the address last notified to the Directorate by the supplier, shall be deemed to have been received by the supplier although returned with the remarks 'refused', 'where about not known', or words to that effect or for any other reason whatsoever.

It is further agreed that the award as and when made for an amount exceeding Rs.10,000/- by the arbitrator shall be a speaking award. It is further provided by the agreement that the party desired to invoke arbitration clause shall distinctly specify the dispute to be determined by arbitration. Only those disputes or dispute out of the disputes shall be referred to the arbitration, as may be determined by the Director (AYUSH), or arising out of and relating to the contract for the fulfilment of contractual obligations of the parties.

(H) JURISDICTION OF COURTS:

All the disputes relating to this Tender Enquiry and Rate Contract shall be subject to the territorial jurisdiction of Courts at Delhi/New Delhi only.

(I) FORCE MAJEURE:

If, at any time, during the continuance of the agreement the performance in whole or in part, by the firm, of any obligation specified in the agreement, is prevented, restricted, delayed or interfered, by reason of war or hostility, act of public enemy, civic commotion, sabotage, act of State or direction from statutory authority, explosion, epidemic, quarantine restriction, fire, floods, natural calamities or any act of GOD,(hereafter referred to as event), provided noticed of happenings of any such event is given by the firm to Directorate of AYUSH within seven calendar days from the date of occurrence thereof, the firm may be excused from performance of its obligation. Provided further that the obligations under the Agreement shall be resumed by the firm, as soon as practicable, after such event comes to an end or ceases to exist. The decision of Directorate of AYUSH as to whether the obligations may be so resumed (and the time frame within which the obligations may be resumed) or not, shall be final and conclusive.

However, the Force Majeure events mentioned above will not, in any way, cause extension of the period of the Agreement.

(J) FALL CLAUSE:

The rate quoted by the Bidder should not be higher than the rate quoted by him to other Government Institutions/agencies within the Government during the contract period.

If any time during the contract period, the Supplier reduces the sale price, sells or offers to sell such stores, as are covered under the contract to any person/organization, including any Department of Central Govt./GNCTD at a price lower than the price chargeable under the contract, he shall forthwith notify such reduction or sale or offer to sale, to Directorate and the price payable under the contract for the supplies after this period will be reduced correspondingly.

(K) VALIDITY OF RATE CONTRACT:

- i. The Rate Contract agreement shall be valid for Two years from date of agreement and during the rate contract period the rates quoted shall remain firm **and no increase** will be allowed during the entire period except in case of and up to any change in the tax/duties applicable to the products in question. In case of any fresh tax/duty, levied on the medicines in question or in case of imposition of any fresh tax/duty, the increase in rate in such cases would be allowed to the extent as clearly attributable to the change in rate of duty/tax or imposition of any fresh duty/tax. The Rate contract may be extended for further one year on mutual agreement.
- ii. If the Supplier commits default of any of the terms and conditions of the agreement, the decision of the Director (AYUSH) shall be final and binding upon the supplier.
- iii. The drug for which rate has been quoted should not be a banned drug under section 26(A) of Drug and Cosmetic Act 1940.

(L) CODE OF INTEGRITY:

No official of the procuring entity or a bidder shall act in contravention of the codes which include-

(i) Prohibition of:

- a) Making offer, solicitation or acceptance of bribe, reward or gift or any material benefit, either directly or indirectly, in exchange for an unfair advantage in the procurement process or to otherwise influence the procurement process.
- b) Any omission, or misrepresentation that may mislead or attempt to mislead so that financial or other benefit may be obtained or an obligation avoided.
- c) Any collusion, bid rigging or anticompetitive behavior that may impair the transparency, fairness and the progress of the procurement process.

- d) Improper use of information provided by the procuring entity to the bidder with an intent to gain unfair advantage in the procurement process or for personal gain.
 - e) Any financial or business transactions between the bidder and any official or the procuring entity related to tender or execution process of contract, which can affect the decision of the procuring entity directly or indirectly.
 - f) Any coercion or any threat to impair or harm, directly or indirectly, any party or its property to influence the procurement process
 - g) Obstruction of any investigation or auditing of a procurement process
 - h) Making false declaration or providing false information for participation in a tender process or to secure a contract;
- ii) **Disclosure of conflict of interest:**
- iii) Disclosure by the bidder of any previous transgressions made in respect of the provisions of sub-clause (i) with any entity in any country during the last three years or of being debarred by any other procuring entity.

If the procuring entity, after giving a reasonable opportunity of being heard, comes to the conclusion that a bidder or prospective bidder, as the case may be, has contravened the code of integrity, may take appropriate measures.

(M) Termination for Default:-

The Directorate of AYUSH, GNCTD may, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of contract, by written notice of default sent to the supplier, terminate the contract in whole or in part:-

- i. If the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods within the time period specified in the contract.
- ii. If the supplier fails to promptly replace any goods rejected by the inspection committee or not conforming to the quality tests, after giving prompt notice, within the specified time period.
- iii. If the supplier fails to fulfill any other terms and conditions of the rate contract.

(N) Procedure For Black Listing:-

- i. If the successful Bidder fails to comply with tender conditions and commits default in the performance of the contract, such bidders shall be blacklisted for a period of **Five Years**.
- ii. Each and every batch of medicines supplied by the suppliers shall be subjected to batch wise quality check and analytical testing by the Authorized Inspection Committee. Medicines rejected on the basis of physical and laboratory reports or not found standard quality in testing shall be destroyed at the cost of bidder.

- iii. Medicines not accepted by the Inspection committee due to other reasons will be returned to the firm on supplying of fresh medicines and within stipulated time.
- iv. If the Committee, after inspection of the medicine, rejects the supply, a chance will be given to the supplier to re-supply the same medicine from other than the supplied batch. If second time, same medicine of another batch also fails or two different batches of a particular medicine supplied against one supply order by the supplier fails the inspection/Analytical testing, then that particular item shall be banned/debarred for a period of **Five Years** followed by delisting from the Rate Contract.
- v. If five or more than five supplied medicines of a firm, fail in batch wise testing, then the firm shall be banned/debarred for a period of **Five Years** followed by delisting from the Rate Contract.
- vi. If the particular item of a firm has been banned/debarred according to the procedure stated above, the supplier/s will not be eligible for participating in the tenders by Tender Inviting Authority for that particular item for a period of **Five Years**, immediately succeeding the period in which supplies were made to procuring entity
- vii. If, after issue of tender enquiry or during the currency of contract, the firm is deregistered/debarred/suspended/blacklisted or banned by any agency for supply of the items, all orders already placed by the Department will stand cancelled and the firm will be debarred from future tenders for a period of **Five years** from the date of issue of such order. The bidder shall be under obligation to inform the procuring entity of such orders deregistering/debarring their firm.
- viii. Any monetary claim arising due to violation of any terms and conditions of the Contract agreement, the amount shall be recovered in following manner:
 - 1) Directly from the supplier
 - 2) Failing which, from the Performance Security
 - 3) If the amount at (2) above is not sufficient for the purpose, recovery of dues shall be recovered as arrears of Land Revenue under provisions of the relevant Act.

(O) Others:-

- 1- The bidder must sign this copy of the terms and conditions over his authorized rubber stamps in token of having read, understood and agreed with the said terms and condition.

- 2- Copies of all the documents uploaded/submitted with the tender have to be duly attested by Notary/Legal Attesting Authority.
- 3- Power of attorney/Authority Letter in the name of person attending on behalf of the company/firm shall be duly verified by the by Notary/Legal Attesting Authority on Ten rupees stamp paper and must be furnished by representative of bidder at the time of pre bid conference and/or at the time of Bids opening.
- 4- The samples submitted at the time of Technical Bid shall be retained by the purchaser. The bidder shall not have any claim for these samples submitted and purchaser shall not pay any cost.
- 5- Rates should be quoted on "for destination basis or free delivery on door basis". All the transit expenses shall be borne by the supplier firm (any monetary limit is not acceptable).
- 6- Rates quoted on packing shall not be considered and shall be summarily rejected.
- 7- No conditional offer/discount for early delivery /payment etc. will be acceptable. Any conditional price/rate quote shall render the Price Bid disqualified on the ground of conditionality.
- 8- The prices quoted by the bidder shall be firm and on fixed basis during the currency/validity of the Rate Contract.
- 9- The price quoted by the bidder should not be more than the Maximum Retail Price (MRP).
- 10- The purchaser reserves the right to reject any/all tenders/offers including lowest quotations without assigning any reason what so ever or to cancel the e-tendering process and reject all the tenders at any time prior to award of contract without incurring any liability whatsoever to the affected bidders.
- 11- No request for Revision of rates during contract period will be considered. Rates once approved shall be for the full contract period.
- 12- After the acceptance of Rate by the Director (AYUSH), orders shall be placed and Supplier will supply them at any place mentioned in the supply/purchase order within the territorial limits of NCT of Delhi.
- 13- The supply is subject to the approval by the authorized Inspection Committee which will have right to reject, if not found as per approved specifications.
- 14- If a firm is deregistered/debarred/suspended/blacklisted/banned for the supply of any particular item by any other agency after issue of tender enquiry, offer for such item will not be considered. The bidder shall be under obligation to inform the procuring entity of such orders deregistering/debarring their firm.
